There have been some key changes to the conference planning this year.

- A conference committee vets the sessions. Proposed sessions must meet all of the conditions described below, or the committee will reject the proposal.
- For students applying to give a paper at the conference, the committee **MUST** receive an email, at the time of application, from the supervisor indicating their support of the student's participation.
- MA or MFA students may not chair sessions.
- Ph.D students may chair sessions with a letter of recommendation from their thesis supervisor; the letter must provide proof that the student has been mentored in organizing a conference session.
- For non-affiliated artists or other professionals please provide a c.v. if requested by the session Chair.
- Session proposals should not be organized with a pre-arranged group of speakers or as a seminar for the session chair's graduate students. The call for papers is an open invitation to all members to give a paper.
- Do not submit more than one proposal to the conference sessions.
- Single sessions include a maximum of 3 papers; double sessions have 6 papers. A session chair may propose no more than one double session.
- We do not support virtual presentations at this time.
